On December, 10, 11 and 12th, 2010, at the University of San Francisco, labor video, computer and media trade unionists and workers will come together to show how new communication technology and tools are being used in the labor movement now, and how they can be used in the future.

The ability to stream our rallies and strikes on the web, and to use cell phones to get our messages out can be a vital element in bringing education and solidarity to the labor movement and changing the dynamics of the struggle.

This 3 day conference will focus on how working people can get ahead of the curve in building our own communication networks and breaking the media blockade that prevents our stories from getting out.

We will also discuss how labor can develop a labor media strategy and agenda that defends democratic control of the Internet and make the public use of the airwaves an issue for all people.

We will have workshops on how to use flip camera and iPhones in covering your struggles, how to stream your rallies, how to develop a labor TV show, how to protect your privacy at work and in the streets, and how to build labor film festivals. There will also be forums on the defense of journalists and the fight to defend the Internet from corporations and governments that have their own agendas.

We will also have a screening of videos from throughout the US and around the world.
